

states for meeting the entire requirement of foodgrains of the country;

(b) whether it is also a fact that certain cereal producing state have also diverted to cash crop;

(c) whether it is a fact that area under wheat cultivation has gone down in the country, if so, steps being taken by Government to meet the situation?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE (SHRI MULLAPPALLY RAMACHANDRAN): (a) Wheat production is concentrated in Punjab, Haryana, Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Bihar. Whereas in the case of Paddy, Andhra Pradesh, Haryana, Madhya Pradesh, Orissa, Punjab, Tamil Nadu, Uttar Pradesh and West Bengal account for the bulk of production.

(b) There is some diversion of area at margin from cereal crops to cash crops like oilseeds, cotton, coconut, sugarcane in certain States.

(c) There has not been any significant decline in the area under wheat cultivation at all-India level.

Revamping of Dairy Development

3276. SHRI B. K. HARIPRASAD: Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government are aware of the study conducted in Saurashtra on the cost of milk production and its sale price indicating that the landless farmers make a marginal profit of only 5 percent as against about 10 per cent by the large dairy farmers as reported in the Indian Dairyman of June, 1992.

(b) whether Government are also aware that similar or worst dismal picture exists throughout the country in spite of operation floods and foreign aids, loans and grants which

have been poured especially in Gujarat Cooperatives; and

(c) whether Government propose to revamp the entire dairy development work and entrust this to states as dairying is a State subject?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE (SHRI K. C. LENKA): (a) and (b) The study "Cost and Returns of Buffalo Milk Production in Rajkot District of Saurashtra" as reported in the June, 1992 issue of "Indian Dairyman" suffers from limitations in methodology and small size of samples. A recent study of Operation Flood milksheds conducted by the National Council of Applied Economic Research, which provides data on economics of milk production, shows a significant return to the household.

(c) Dairy Development projects are already being implemented by the respective State Governments/state dairy co-operatives.
