Promotion in the Schools under the Directorate of Education, Delhi Administration

3365. SHRI V. NARAYANASAMY: Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

(a) the number of available vacancies as on date subject-wise PGTs against the promotion quota in schools under the Directorate of Education, Delhi Administration;

(b) whether it is a fact that in the subject of English sufficient number of department candidates are not available against the quota for promotions as PGTs;

(c) if so, whether it is also a fact that some of the Teachers who applied for promotion as PGTs in English against the promotion quota in December, 1991 and again on 1st April, 1992 have not been covered in eligibility List issued in June, 1992 on such flimsy grounds as non-receipt of their applications by the prescribed date;

(d) whether it is a fact that an eligible TGT has to apply for promotion as PGT each time a circular is issued by the Directorate in case he fails to apply by the prescribed date and his earlier application received after the due date are not treated as valid; and

(e) whether it is a fact that non-promotion of eligible TGT as PGTs despite their submitting the applications is putting them to recurring financial losses *vis-a-vis* junior teachers promoted earlier and how the Directorate proposes to compensate them?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION AND DEPARTMENT OF CULTURE) (KUMARI SELJA): (a) According to the infor-

mation furnished by the Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU) the number of students enrolled in the University during the last three years is as under:

1989-90	48,281
1990-91	52,376
1991-92	62,375

(b) the first batch of students of the Bachelor's degree Programme (B.A./B. Com) of the University appeared for their final examination only in June, 1992, the results of which have not yet been declared. A part from this, 143 students cleared the MBA Course and 310 students cleared the Bachelor in Library and Information Sciences (BLIS) in 1991-92.
