#### **Educational Upliftment of Minorities**

3354. SHRI MOHAMMED AFZAL alias MEEM AFZAL: Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

(a) the details of steps taken by Government for educational upliftment of minorities during the Seventh Plan period;

(b) the results achieved therefrom; and

(c) what further schemes/plans are being devised for educational upliftment of Muslims in the country?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION AND DEPARTMENT OF CULTURE) (KUMARI SELJA):

(a) Major programmes taken up for the educationally backward minorities during the Seventh Plan period include coaching programme for preparing students for competitive examinations, setting up community polytechnics in minority concentration districts and training of teachers of minority managed schools.

(b) So far, coaching classes were organised in 20 universities and 33 colleges benefitting about 24,000 candidates. A community polytechnic was set up in each of 41 minority concentration districts. 450 principals and 950 teachers belonging to minority managed schools were trained by NCERT.

(c) The Programme of Action (POA) which is being revised in pursuance of the modified National Policy on Education and which is to be placed in Parliament shortly, envisages a number of programmes for educationally backward minorities,
