

(b) whether any special recruitment drive is proposed to be conducted to fill-up the vacancies;

(c) if so, the details thereof; and

(d) if not, the reasons therefor?

THE MINISTER OF WELFARE (SHRI SITARAM KESRI): (a) As per information available the backlog of vacancies reserved for handicapped as reported by Central Government Offices and Central Public Sector Undertakings is 487 and 262 for Group C and D posts as on 1.1.1992.

(b) to (d) Special Recruitment drives have been conducted in 1987, 1988 and 1990 to fill up the backlog of vacancies reserved for handicapped under Visually and hearing handicapped category. The process of filling up of these vacancies on the basis of Special Recruitment Drive 1990 is still continuing.

Overseas Scholarship Scheme for SC/ST

371. SHRI VISHWASRAO RAMA-RAO PATIL: Will the Minister of WELFARE be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that most of the students under the National Overseas Scholarships schemes for Scheduled Caste/ Scheduled Tribe and other weaker sections of the society are unable to complete their studies within the prescribed time limit;

(b) if so, the reasons therefor; and

(c) the number of students gone abroad under the scheme so far and the number of those who have not returned as per the terms and conditions of the agreement?

THE MINISTER OF WELFARE (SHRI SITARAM KESRI): (a) The awardees of National Overseas Scholarship have been by and large requesting for extensions of time for completing their studies.

(b) Difference in academic standards and problems of adjustment may be the reasons.

(c) Out of 445 students sent abroad so far, 11 students have not returned to India as per the terms and conditions of agreement.

(c) what is the number of child marriage, performed annually; and

(d) what further measures are contemplated by Government in this regard?

THE MINISTER OF WELFARE (SHRI SITARAM KESRI): (a) to (d) The information is being collected and will be laid on the table of the House.

Facilities for the National Commission for SC/ST

373. SHRI KAMESHWAR PASWAN: Will the Minister of WELFARE be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that the Chairman of the National Commission for Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes has protested against the inadequate facilities for its proper functioning, if so, the details thereof; and

(b) the action taken thereon?

THE MINISTER OF WELFARE (SHRI SITARAM KESRI): (a) The Chairman, National Commission for SCs and STs has written letters for transfer of posts including assets and liabilities of the erstwhile office of the Commissioner for SCs and STs and restoration of some posts abolished in the erstwhile National Commission

for SCs and STs to the newly constituted National Commission for SCs and STs. The Commission has also proposed for creation of some additional posts.

(b) The whole issue is under examination.

Educational Institutions set up by Minority Community

374. MAULANA OBAIDULLAH KHAN AZMI: Will the Minister of WELFARE be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that the Minorities Commission in its latest report has observed that the educational institutions established by minority communities were often not given recognition and that there were delays in sanctioning of funds etc.; and

(b) if so, what is Government's reaction thereto?

THE MINISTER OF WELFARE (SHRI SITARAM KESRI): (a) and (b) In its successive Annual Reports the Minorities Commission has been observing that the educational institutions established by the minority communities are facing difficulties in the matter of their recognition and release of grants-in-aid by the State Governments. The action in this regard is to be taken by the State Governments. However, the Department of Education has circulated a set of guidelines to the State Governments for recognition of minority educational institutions.

Recasting of 15-Point Programme

375. MAULANA OBAIDULLAH KHAN AZMI: Will the Minister of WELFARE be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government propose to recast the 15-Point programme for minorities;

(b) whether it is a fact that the recommendations of the Minorities Commission are proposed to be included in the revised programme;

(c) if so, the recommendations that are likely to be included; and

(d) by when the revised programme is likely to be announced?

THE MINISTER OF WELFARE (SHRI SITARAM KESRI): (a) Yes, Sir.

(a) whether there is any SC and ST lists pending for President's assent; if so, their number and reasons for pendency; and

(b) the steps taken/being taken to clear them?

THE MINISTER OF WELFARE (SHRI SITARAM KESRI): (a) No, Sir.

(a) whether it is a fact that menace of drug abuse is acquiring dangerous proportions, especially in the North-Eastern States and Rajasthan;

(b) if so, what are the details thereof; and

(c) what remedial steps Government have taken/propose to take in the matter?

THE MINISTER OF WELFARE (SHRI SITARAM KESRI): (a) and (b) No survey has been conducted so far to know the exact number of drug addicts in the country. However, the problem in the North-Eastern States has become serious because of the in-
