

Deployment of additional battalion on the Bowler by Myanmar

@3992. MISS SAROJ KHAPARDE: Will the Minister of DEFENCE be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that Myanmar's borders with India which were covered by five battalions of regular infantry before 1988, are now covered by more than thirty-two battalions, as per the newsitem captioned 'Myanmar deploys 32 battalions along Indian border' which appeared in the 'Times of India', dated 17th June, 1992;

(b) if so, what are the details thereof; and

(c) what steps Government have taken/proposed to take in the matter?

THE MINISTER OF DEFENCE (SHRI SHARAD PAWAR): (a) to (c) Government do not have confirmed reports to suggest the deployment of 32 Myanmar infantry battalions along the Indo-Myanmar border. Government keeps a constant watch on all developments impinging on national security and takes appropriate measures, from time to time, to ensure defence preparedness.

Delay for finalising Rum contract by CKD, Bombay

3993. SHRI SATYA PRAKASH MALAVIYA: Will the Minister of DEFENCE, be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that the Rum contract for the year 1992-93 has not yet been finalised by army Canteen Stores Department, Bombay; and

(b) if so, the reasons for the delay in finalising the contract and by when it is likely to be finalised?

THE MINISTER OF DEFENCE (SHRI SHARAD PAWAR): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) Rum contracts for the year 1990-91 and 1991-92 were finalised in October 1990 and November 1991, respectively. The process for finalisation of contracts for the year 1992-93 is in progress. The stocks of Rum are sufficient to meet Defence requirement till the supplies against new contracts start coming in.

Retirement benefit to disabled army personnel

3994. SHRI SYED SIBTEY RAZI: Will the Minister of DEFENCE be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government have been requested to relax eligibility conditions for retirement benefits in case of armed forces personnel disabled during service;

(b) if so, what are the details thereof;

(c) whether any action on these requests has since been taken;

(d) whether Government propose to provide similar reliefs to civilian employees of Central Government and State Governments; and

(e) if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor?

THE MINISTER OF DEFENCE (SHRI SHARAD PAWAR): (a) No, Sir.

Army Jeeps purchased by Maharashtra' Legislators

3995. DR. SHRIKANT RAMCHANDRA JICHKAR: Will the Minister of DEFENCE be pleased to state:

(a) what is the total number of jeeps purchased by Maharashtra legislators during the last 5 years from the Defence quota allotted to them; and

(b) what is the number of legislators who have benefited from this scheme?

THE MINISTER OF DEFENCE (SHRI SHARAD PAWAR): (a) and (b) During the last five years, 272 jeeps were allotted to Maharashtra Legislators from pool of Disposal Vehicles (Legislators' Pool), out of which 8 Legislators took delivery of 8 jeeps, after payment of cost.

Promotions of Army Officers

3997. DR. BALDEV PRAKASH: Will the Minister of DEFENCE be pleased to state:

(a) the number of army officers of all the three wings i.e. the army, navy and air force who had approached various courts in the country regarding their promotions;

(b) the criteria for the promotion of army officers to the higher ranks; and

(c) the number of cases in which the courts have upheld officers' contention during the last two years?

THE MINISTER OF DEFENCE (SHRI SHARAD PAWAR): (a) to (c) 82 Army, Navy and Air Force officers approached various Courts during 1990 and 1991 regarding their promotions; of these 8 were decided in favour of the petitioners.

The selection for promotion of officers to the higher ranks is made on the basis of their career profile, seniority and relative merit.
