Functioning of the Institute of applied manpower research

4089. SHRI SUSHILKUMAR SAM-
BHAIJIRAO SHINDE: Will the Minister
of PLANNING AND PROGRAMME
IMPLEMENTATION De pleased to state:

(a) whether the functioning of the
Institute of Applied Manpower Research
has been lately evaluated;

(b) what are the major areas in which
the Institute has done some original re-
search which was not earlier done any
where in the country;

(c) what is the total amount of ex-
penditure incurred on this Institute; and

(d) what is the stength of the em-
ployed stag of Institute?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE
MINISTRY OF PLANNING AND PRO-
GRAMME IMPLEMENTATION AND,
THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE
MINISTRY OF NON-CONVENTIONAL
ENERGY SOURCES (SHRI SUKH
RAM): (a) The functioning of the In-
stitute of Applied Manpower Research
(IAMR) Is regularly reviewed by the
Executive Council, the Standing Com-
mittee on Research Programmes, and the

General Council, chaired respectively by-
Secretary, a Member, and Deputy Chair-
man, Planning Commission. A review
of the activities of the Institute was also
undertaken in the Planning Commission
as a part of the examination of their
proposals, for the Eighth Plan. A Com-
mittee was earlier appointed under the
Chairmanship of Shri G. Parthasarthy
to review the performance of the Insti-
tute over the years and make recom-
mendations regarding its future work.
Although the Committee did not submit
a formal report, the views arising out of
its deliberations were put up to the
Executive Council in 1991 and were also
used for drawing up the perspective plan
of the activities for the Institute. A
national expert committee under the Chair-
manship of Prof. S. Sampath was also
set up to evaluate the National Techni-
cal Manpower Information System
(NTMIS) — a project of IAMR spon-
sored by Ministry of Human Resource
Development.

(b) The Institute is the only national
level institution in the country specialis-
ing in research and training in the area
of manpower and employment planning.
Its important and distinctive research
work includes (a) preparation of national
manpower accounts; (b) studies on man.-

power requirements in various sectors of the economy and specific manpower categories; and (c) building up of an information base on technical manpower through the National Technical Manpower Information System (NTMIS).

(c) The Planning Commission provides recurring maintenance grants-in-aid to the Institute; and the Institute incurred an expenditure of Rs. 1.20 crores from the grants-in-aid received from the Planning Commission. The Institute also receives grants-in-aid from sponsors of projects. A major project of this type is MTMIS. During 1991-92, the Institute incurred an expenditure of Rs. 17.99 lakhs on this project from the grants-in-aid received from the Ministry of Human Resource Development.

(d) The total staff strength of the Institute as on date is 206.
