Excessive Import of certain drugs

4180. SHRI ABDUL SAMAD SIDDIQUI: Will the Minister of COMMERCE be pleased to state:

(a) whether the allegations of excessive imports than actual requirement for actual production of Ethambutol, Rifampicin, Cephalexin and several other drugs have been received against a leading producer;

(b) whether it is a fact that his Ministry has failed to give the details of total imports of raw materials for export production of the above drugs, total exports, FOB value of exports CIF import contents, CCS paid from the year 1987-88 onwards and as a result the company has cheated the exchequer by crores of rupee with tie-up of certain beaurocrats of his Ministry;

(c) what are the full facts of this case and what is the stage at which the matter stands; and

(d) whether it is a fact that, no action can be taken for excessive import made by this company in the

past against advance licences and open general licences having announced the new Exim policy?
