The objectives for setting up of IIFM, EPCO and DMI, Bhopal.

**1. Indian Institute of Project Management:**

The main objectives of the institute are to offer advanced. The main objectives, of the institute are to offer advanced training in Forestry Management to in service forest officers, officers of forest Development Corporations and Forest related industries with a view to equip them to practice the art and profession of management of forestry development, to select and prepare outstanding and talented young persons for careers leading to management responsibility in forestry and the forest related systems. The institute offers a post graduate Forestry Management Diploma Course.

**2. Environment Protection and Co-ordination Organisation.**

The Organisation is an autonomous body assisted by the Government of Madhya Pradesh.

Government of India have set up an ENVIS Centre under its Environment Information System Scheme in the Environmental Protection and Co-ordination Organisation in 1984 with the objective of collection, collation, storage, retrieval and dissemination of information to the user group in the field of Environmental management relating to the state of Madhya Pradesh.

**3. Disaster Management Institute, Madhya Pradesh.**

The Institute is under the administrative control of the Government of Madhya Pradesh.

The main objectives of the institute are to provide training in Disaster Management and related fields for officials of Government Dep'ts., Public & Private sector, to run post-graduate diploma and degree courses in Disaster Management and Industrial Safety, to carry out research studies in disaster management, to collect, store and disseminate information on matters related to hazards and disasters,

to offer consultancy services to industries and others and award scholarships, fellowships, prizes and medals for better disaster management.

**Preservation of one-horned rhinos in Assam**

4394. SHRIMATI BASANTI SARMA: Will the Minister of ENVIRONMENT AND FORESTS be pleased to state:

(a) whether any proposal has been received One-horned Rhinos' in Assam;

(b) whether the proposal has been approved by Government; and

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF ENVIRONMENT AND FORESTS (SHRI KAMAL NATH): (a) to (c) A centrally sponsored Scheme titled "Conservation of Rhinos in Assam" has been continuing since 1986-87. The scheme has been transferred to the State Plan Sector from the year 1992-93 along with the budget provision of Rs. 75 lakhs.

Under the Scheme, central assistance was provided for strengthening the infrastructure for protection and conservation of Rhinos along with its habitats. The financial assistance released under the Scheme during the Seventh Five Year Plan, 1990-91 and 1991-92 was to the tune of Rs. 3.07 crores, Rs. 0.97 crores and Rs. 1.69 crores respectively.
