honorarium of Rs. 4,000/- p.m. plus a
contingency grant on annual basis.

nished by UGC, there is no proposal
at present to increase the emoluments.

(c) if so, what are the findings thereof?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION AND DEPARTMENT OF CULTURE) (KUMARI SELJA): (a) At present, there are 3 National Research Professors as indicated below:

(1) Dr. C. R. Rao—Mathematics/
Statistics

(2) Smt. M. Subhulakshmi—Music

(3) Dr. K. N. Raj—Economics

(b) and (c) National Research Professorship is an honour which is conferred upon distinguished academics and scholars in recognition of their valuable contribution to knowledge. Persons of real eminence who have at-

tained the age of 65 years and have made outstanding contribution in their respective fields and are still capable of further research are appointed as National Research Professors. No specific duties and responsibilities have been assigned to National Research Professors. They are free to pursue research work in their chosen fields at the University or Institution of their choice. The scheme does not envisage any evaluation of the work done by distinguished scholars appointed as National Research Professors.
