(c) The NCC is funded jointly by the Centre and the States /Union Territory Administrations. The expenditure incurred under the relevant Sub Head of account for NCC in the Ministry of Defence budget for the past three years is as below;

1989-90	Rs. 16,04 crores
1990-91	Rs. 15,32 crores
1991-92	Rs. 63.25 crores

For 1989-90 and 1990-91, only expenditure relating to pay and allowances of Associate NCC Officers, clothing for Cadets, camp expenditure ete. were booked against the Sub Head Of account. From 1991-92, all expenditure relating to NCC is being booked under this Sub Head.

The above figures do not include the expenditure incurred by other Ministries in the Centre on NCC in schools/colleges run by them and the expenditure booked by the States in their respective budgets.

#### **Trials of Arjun Tank**

# 1813. DR. ABRAR AHMED: SHRI SURESH KALMADI:

Will the Minister of DEFENCE be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that the re cently concluded summer trials on the main battle tank, "Arjun", have confirm ed that the tank has major technical pro blems and needs to undertake futher te chnical trial<sub>s</sub> in 1993 summer;

(b) if so, whether it will effect in any way the production schedule of Arjun tentatively fixed for 1993; and

(c) what steps Government propose to take to meet the situation?

THE MINISTER OF DEFENCE (SHRI SHARAD PAWAR); (a) and (b) No, Sir. The recently concluded summer trials have given very encouraging results. "These trials have proved that the major problems encountered during 1991 trials have been overcome. The minor problems noticed during these trials are being simultaneously attended-to so as improve the reliability of the tank. 6 Preproduction series tanks are likely to be tried out by the Army for troops trials during 1993 summer. The bulk production of ARJUN will commence after successful completion of troops trials during 1993 summer.

(c) The project is already being very closely monitored by a high powered three tier management structure to overcome any problem arising during development and trial stage.

### Setting up of food processing industries in Maharashtra

1814. SHRI SATISH PRADHAN; Will the Minister of FOOD PROCESSING INDUSTRIES be pleased to state:

(a) details of proposals to set up food processing industries received by the Union Government from Maharashtra during last one year, proposals cleared with estimated cost, location and other details:

(b) details of proposals from Maharashtra pending and action taken thereon. and

(c) whether new policy regarding food processing has been formulated to encourage growth of such industrv and export promotion: if so, the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF FOOD PROCESSING INDUSTRIES (SHRI GIRIDHAR GO-MANGO): (a) and (b) One proposal for grant of financial assistance to the tune of Rs. 57.10 lakhs was received from the Goverriment of Maharashtra during 1991-92 and the same has been approved. In addition to this, one 100 per cent EOU project relating to pre-coolins of grapes by M/s. Shriram Grapes Cooperative Society Ltd., Pippal-gaon has been approved. Government have also approved a joint venture proposal submitted bv M/s. JMPRCO Ltd.. a company incorporated in Honskona having NRI equity share hold of 60 per cent and 40 per cent by M/s. Coca Cola Co., South Asia Holdings, wholly owned subsidiary of the Coca Cola Co of USA with M-s. Britannia Industries

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Ltd., Calcutta and a Maharashtra State Government Agency for setting up of a unit for manufacture of processed extruded snacks, processed nut potato chips and non-alcoholic beverage bases/essences in a backward district of Maharashtra by setting up a new company to be known as BR1TCO Foods Pvt. Ltd. Reserve Bank of India has granted approval to M/s. Kellog Company of USA to enter into financial-cum-technical collaboration with proposed Indian company viz., M/s. Kellogg (India) Limited for setting up of cereal processing unit in Raigarh District, Maharashtra under automatic approval schemes

(c) Yes, Sir. For encouraging the growth of food processing industry Government have placed all food processing industries except brewing and distillation of alcoholic drinks/beverages in the list of priority industries and have liberalised foreign technology agreement, foreign investments, foreign collabora-rations etc. Government provided fiscal relief by abolishing/reducting excise duties on a large number of processed food items and reducing customs duties on a large number of food processing machinery and equipments. For export promotion, various incentive schemes havve been announced and export import policy have been liberalised.

### Food Processing units in Bihar

1815. SHRI S. S. AHLUWALIA: Will the Minister of FOOD PROCESSING INDUSTRIES be pleased to state:

(a) whather Government have prepared any scheme or action plan for the development and establishment of food processing industries in the State of Bihar;

(b) if no, what are the details thereof;

(c) if answer to (a) above be in the negative whether Government propose to make a survey in Bihar about its suitability for setting up food processing industries in the State and advise the in-industrialfots including multinationals to set up food processing units in Bihar; and

(d) if not, the reasons therefor?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF FOOD PROCESSING INDUSTRIES (SHRI GIRIDHAR GO-MANGO): (a) to (d) While this Ministry does not set up food processing units in any State directly, the Ministry has formulated several development plan schemes for to State providing assistance Governments/State Government Sectors/ Organisations/Cooperatives/Joint Assisted sectors of for setting up, modernisation/diversification of food processing units in any parft of the country including State of Bihar. These schemes interalia include assistance for setting up/ enlarging/modernising fruit and vegetable processing units, meat, pork, popultry and egg processing units, fish processing units, cold chain, modernisation of rice hul-lers food procesing training centres and studies including survey and project report preparation for food processing sector. No request has been received from Government Bihar sseeking of assistance for survey/studies.

# World Bank funds for deep sea fisheries

## 1816. SHRI KRISHNA KUMAR BIRLA: SHRI MENTAY PADMANABHAM:

Will the Minister of FOOD PROCES-SING INDUSTRIES be pleased to state:

(a) whether the Food and Agricultural Organisation of the United Nations has recently recommended *to* the World Bank to make available funds, for the development of deep sea fisheries in India;

(b) if so, the expected funds Government likely o get from the World Bank;

(c) the details of the plans of the Government to utilise the funds; and

(d) the extent to which the development of deep sea fisheries would be made?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF FOOD PROCESSING INDUSTRIES (SHRI GIRIDHAR GO-MANGO): (a) While forwarding a Report submitted by FAO Consultant on Study of Deep Sea Fisheries Development in India, FAO has intimated that
