2208. SHRI SATISH PRA-DHAN: Will the Minister of RAILWAYS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether there is any proposal to reorganise the existing Divisions and Zones of Indian Railways in Maharashtra:

- (c) what new proposals have been approved during the current year for Sholapur Division particularly laving of new lines and conversion of metre gauge into broad gauge alongwith the details of progress made in this regard?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF RAILWAYS (SHRI MALLIKARJUN): (a) and Railway Reform Comm ttee's recommendations for reorganisation of railways by creating new Zones and Divisions are with the Ministry but financial constraints have precluded the possibility of going in for any new Zone or Division.

(c) No new line work is in progress on Sholapur Division. However, gauge conversion work in Daund-Baramat section is progress. Miraj-Latur and Sholapur-Gadag sections have been included in the action plan for gauge conversion and are likely to be taken up in the coming years as per availability of resources
