

Diplomatic relations with countries belonging to erstwhile Soviet Union

2315. SHRI SOM PAL:

DR. NAUNihal:

Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state:

(a) what are the countries belonging to the erstwhile Soviet Union with whom we have established formal diplomatic relations;

(b) the countries in this group with whom we do not have diplomatic relations so far;

(c) the countries among them where we have opened our diplomatic or commercial consulates;

(d) what is the status of these missions in the respective countries; and

(e) by when all the countries are proposed to be covered in this respect?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHRI EDUARDO FALEIRO): (a) and (b) India has recognised all 15 countries that emerged from the former Soviet Union. Formal diplomatic relations have been established with Russia, Kazakhstan, Uzbekistan, Ukraine, Estonia; Latvia, Lithuania, Moldova, Azerbaijan, Turkmenistan and Kyrgyzstan. Action is under way to establish relations with Armenia, Georgia and Tajikistan.

(c) to (e) We have opened resident diplomatic Missions in the following countries:

1. Embassy, Moscow-Russia (continues)
2. Embassy, Minsk-Belarus
3. Embassy, Alma Atta-Kazakhstan.
4. Embassy, Taschkent-Uzzegistan.
5. Embassy, Kiev-Ukraine.
6. Consulate General, Odessa-Ukraine.

Action is under way to open Consulates General in St. Petersburg and Vladivostok.

Besides these resident Missions, following countries are covered by concurrent accreditation:

1. Estonia from Finland.
2. Latvia from Sweden.
3. Lithuania from Poland.
4. Moldova from Romania.
5. Georgia and Armenia (proposed to be accredited from Ukraine).
6. Azerbaijan from Uzbekistan.
7. Kyrgyzstan from Kazakhstan.
8. Tajikistan (proposed to be accredited from Kazakhstan).

N.R.I.'s Convention in Bangkok

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHRI R. L. BHATIA): (a) to (c) A Convention of NRIs was held in Bangkok on 16th May, 1992. The Convention had been organised by the NRI Welfare Society of India. We have not received any proposals from the organisers of the Bangkok Convention for the consideration of Government.
