(b) There were 30 cases of thefts involving depositors' stocks and 19 cases of thefts involving the Corporation's own property. The total claimed/estimated value of the commodities/stocks/stores involved was Rs. 7.15 lakhs and Rs. 2.35 lakhs respectively.

(c) Steps have been taken by the Corporation to streamline and strengthen the security arrangements to prevent such thefts. Police have also been requested to have regular rounds in the warehouses and at some centres, homeguards have also been deployed besides the Corporation's own watch and ward staff.
