

for eradication of illiteracy in all States/UTs including Bihar in the country. At present, 238 blocks have so far been covered in the State under 'Operation Blackboard' for substantial improvement in the quality of primary schools. 51,990 Non-Formal Education Centres have been sanctioned for the school drop-outs and Total Literacy Campaigns have been launched in 6 districts of the State covering about 29.50 lakhs illiterate persons in different age groups in a time-bound manner. Three Voluntary agencies and 240 Youth clubs have also taken up literacy campaigns in small and compact areas in six districts.

In addition the 'Bihar Education Project' (BEP) which is jointly sponsored by the Central and State Governments and the UNICEF aims at universalisation of elementary education, drastic reduction in adult illiteracy and equalisation of the educational opportunities with particular focus on women, Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes and poorer sections of the society.

(d) and (e) During 1991-92, grant amounting to Rs. 747.19 lakhs was released to the State Government of Bihar and other agencies working in the field of elementary and adult education as under :

(a) Grants Released for elementary education
