(b) A senior officer of Government of Bihar and an officer from Transport Department, Government of Bihar have claimed to have deciphered the ancient Harappan script. The study is based on assigning certain phonetic value to the symbols used by sacred religious Santhal tribes in their rituals which according to two officers look into However, the Harappan letters. readings are not coherent in all Therefore, it is difficult to accept the decipherment as final.

to discuss launching of such a Mission in the next meeting of the CABE scheduled for August 8, 1992.
