(b) and (c) Assistance under AIBP to the State Government is provided based on AIBP release proposals for projects submitted by the State Government in accordance with AIBP guidelines. The amount of assistance mainly depends on budget provision made for project by the State Government in the state's budget and extent of drought prone/tribal area benefited from the project and included in the AIBP.

## Water Requirement of increasing population

- 241. SHRI MOHD. ALI KHAN: Will the Minister of WATER RESOURCES be pleased to state:
- (a) whether population of the country is expected to 140 crore by 2025; and
- (b) if so, the steps being taken to give water to each State to meet the population requirements in each State especially in Andhra Pradesh?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF WATER RESOURCES (SHRI JAI PRAKASH NARAYAN YADAV): (a) As per report of Technical Group on Population Projection constituted by National Commission on Population, the projection of the population of country is 139 crore by 2025.

(b) Various steps for planning and implementation of water resources projects for meeting the projected requirement of water for different purposes are taken by the respective State Governments. Government of Andhra Pradesh have informed that several activities related to development of water resources have been taken up under "Jalayagnam".

Ministry of Water Resources provides central assistance under its various programmes to all States including Andhra Pradesh. Due emphasis has been laid on development and management of water resources projects during the XI Plan. An outlay of Rs. 2,32,311 crore has been provided for the irrigation, command area development and water management and flood control in the XI Plan against the X Plan outlay of Rs.95,743 crore.
