Cholera Vaccine

895. DR. NARREDDY THULASI REDDY: Will the Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE be pleased to state:

(a) whether efforts have been made to invest a more potent, safe and effective cholera vaccine;

(b) if so, the details thereof; and

(c) if not, the reasons therefor?

THE MINISTER OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI ARJUN SINGH): (a) and (b) Scientists all over the world, including those in India, are trying to develop a more effective vaccine against cholera. 3 major lines of research being pursued for development of a more effective vaccine against cholera are:—

(i) Cholera Toxoid

(ii) Adjuvant Vaccine

(iii) Whole-Cell/B subunits vaccine.

The Department of Bio-Technology has recently launched a major programme in the field of cholera research using new bio-technology approaches.

(c) whether any steps have been taken for the construction of the building for this Hospital; and

THE MINISTER OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI ARJUN SINGH): (a) The Government had posed the Raichur District Hospital Project for assistance from OPEC funds. The Government Board of OPEC funds has approved a loan of US \$ 9 million for the project.

Facilities for Burns Treatment

897. DR. SANJAYA SINH: Will the Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that about 1 lakh persons die of burns every year in the country;

(b) whether it is also a fact that 95 per cent of them die in burn accidents;

(c) if so, what are the facilities available in the country for burns treatment, State/Union Territory-wise;

(d) whether Government have any proposal to increase such facilities; and

(e) if not, what are the reasons therefor?

THE MINISTER OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI ARJUN SINGH): (a) No, Sir.

(c) to (e) The Government do not maintain State-wise statistic regarding the facilities available for burns treatment. As 'Health' is a State subject under the Constitution, it is for the State Governments to augment such facilities in their respective States.
