1435. SHRI SHIV PRATAP MISHRA: Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state :

(a) whether Government's attention has been drawn to the news item that appeared in the Indian Express (ND) dated 5th April, 1992 under the caption 'Dr. Ambedkar Centre, Ministry volte face puts project in jeopardy' regarding release of fund for the proposed multi-crore Dr. B. R. Ambedkar Centre for bio-medical research of Delhi University;

(c) the steps Government propose to take to expedite the release of fund for the project ?

THE MINISTER OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI ARJUN SINGH): (a) Yes, Sir.

(a) whether Government have launched Indira Mahila Yojna;

(b) if so, the details of the scheme; and

(c) what are the achievements so far?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (DEPARTMENT OF YOUTH AFFAIRS AND SPORTS) WITH ADDITIONAL CHARGE OF MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (DEPARTMENT OF WOMEN AND CHILD DEVELOPMENT) (KUMARI MAMATA BANERJEE) : (a) and (b) The Government is committed to the launching of an integrated programme for the development of women and children, named Indira Mahila Yojna. The Scheme has not been launched so far as the details of the scheme and strategy for its implementation are being worked out. The scheme would aim at developing new sense of awareness among women, particularly in rural areas and empowering them so that they become active participants in the process of social transformation and regeneration.

(c) The achievements would be assessed after its launching and implementation for certain period of time.
