

Exploration of Oil and Gas by Private Companies

313. SHRI SURESH KALMADI :

DR. ABRAR AHMED :

Will the Minister of PETROLEUM AND NATURAL GAS be pleased to state :

(a) whether Government have invited international and private companies to bid for 72 blocks—39 Offshore and 33 Onshore—for exploration of oil and gas under the fourth round of bidding; and

(b) if so, the response received therefor ?

THE MINISTER OF PETROLEUM AND NATURAL GAS (SHRI B. SHANKARANAND) : (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) A total of 24 bids have been received from 31 companies, either on their own or in consortium, for 13 blocks—5 offshore and 8 onshore.

Import of Oil

(a) what was the quantum of oil imported by India during the financial year 1991-92 and the amount in respect thereof;

(b) whether it is a fact that more oil was bought from spot market than through term contracts; and

(c) if so, what are the reasons therefor ?

THE MINISTER OF PETROLEUM AND NATURAL GAS (SHRI B. SHANKARANAND) : (a) About 33.2

MMT crude oil and petroleum products valued at Rs. 12,700 crores (approximately) were imported during 1991-92.

(b) Yes, Sir.

(c) Supplies from erstwhile USSR were affected due to their internal developments. Crude oil import requirement increased during the year over the planned quantities due to decline in the indigenous crude oil in the indigenous crude oil production.
