Will the Minister of LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that due to global economic recession labourers in several industries are being retrenched;
- (b) if so, names of the industries where the process of retrenchment has been started; and
- (c) the number of labourers expected to be retrenched during the year 2008 and 2009 as per official assessments?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT (SHRI OSCAR FERNANDES): (a) and (b) As per the newspaper reports, in certain industrial sectors, job losses are taking place. The reports suggest that the job losses have occurred in sectors like textiles, garment, construction, automobiles and steel.

(c) Such an assessment has not been made in the Ministry of Labour and Employment.
