THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE (SHRI TASLIMUDDIN): (a) Yes, Sir. The Union Government had in May 1993 accorded approval for construction of fishing harbour at Jakhau at a total cost of Rs. 1143.60 lakhs under the Centrally Sponsored Scheme with 100 percent Central financial assistance.

(b) The State Government has reported that delay in obtaining environmental clearance is one of the reasons among others that have led to cost escalation.

Growth in agriculture sector

1252. SHRI JAI PRAKASH NARAYAN SINGH: Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that according to data released by Central Statistical Organisation, there is modest growth in agriculture and allied services during 2007-08;

(b) if so, the details thereof;

(c) the reasons for low growth in the food grains during 2007-08; and

(d) the steps being taken for the growth of agriculture sector for the next two years?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE (SHRI KANTI LAL BHURIA): (a) and (b) According to the data released by Central Statistical Organisation (CSO), growth rate of agriculture & allied sectors during 2007-08 at constant (1999-2000) prices was 4.5 per cent.

(c) Total foodgrains increased to 230.67 million tonnes in 2007-08 from 217.25 million tonnes in 2006-07 recording a growth of 6.16 per cent.

(d) Towards improving the growth in the agriculture sector, Government has taken the following steps:

- Launched the National Food Security Mission with an outlay of Rs.4,882 crore for the Eleventh Plan period (2007-08 to 2011-12). It aims to produce additional 10 million tonnes of rice, 8 million tonnes of wheat and 2 million tonnes of pulses by the end of the Eleventh Plan.
- Launched the Rashtriya Krishi Vikas Yojana (RKVY), with an outlay of Rs.25,000 crore for the 11th Plan period which aims at achieving 4% annual growth in the agriculture sector during the Plan period, through incentivising the States to invest more in agriculture sector.
