

(c) No, Sir.

(d) Does not arise.

(e) Indian Railways have a well defined and detailed procedure for recruitment, with adequate and in-built checks and balances. The procedure has evolved over the years and has stood the test of time. It is well geared to meet the requirements of the system adequately, ensuring transparency, fairness and selection, strictly on merit. Details of recruitment to various posts made in different Railways in the last three years, shall be laid on the Table of the Sabha, as mentioned above.

WRITTEN ANSWERS TO UNSTARRED QUESTIONS

1240. SHRI N.K. SINGH: Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE be pleased to state:

(a) whether the National Horticulture Mission has become operational; and

(b) if so, the benefits achieved from the Mission so far?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE (SHRI KANTI LAL BHURIA):
(a) and (b) Yes, Sir. The Department of Agriculture & Cooperation has launched the National Horticulture Mission (NHM) during 2005-06, for holistic development of horticulture sector, duly ensuring an end to end approach having backward and forward linkages covering production, post harvest management and marketing with the active involvement of all the stake holders. All the States and Union Territories are covered under the Mission except the eight North Eastern States including Sikkim and the States of Jammu & Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh and Uttarakhand, which have been covered under another Mission namely, Technology Mission for Integrated Development of Horticulture in the North Eastern States (TMNE). The achievements made under the Mission upto 2007-08 are as under:-

- 1710 new nurseries have been setup.
- An area of about 8.26 lakh ha has been brought under new plantation and an area of 1.2 lakh ha under old and senile plantation has been rejuvenated.
- Organic farming and Integrated Pest Management programme have been taken up in 0.76 lakh ha area and 4.0 lakh ha area respectively.
- Under the post harvest management component, 898 pack houses, 46 cold storages, 14 refrigerated vans, 7 whole sale markets and 45 rural markets have been assisted.

Damage to crops due to rains

(a) whether rains in the months of May-June have damaged the bumper wheat crop;

(b) if so, whether monsoon has been normal with the result that output of wheat and rice have fully improved; and

(c) if so, to what extent Government is confident of achieving the target set for the foodgrains?
