Primary education in Jharkhand

1417. SHRI PARIMAL NATHWANI: Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether many States of the country have a higher percentage of children having completed primary education than in Jharkhand and whether vocational and higher education equips our young people to gain proper employment and become good productive citizens;
- (b) the details of schemes to encourage children to continue education beyond the primary level;
 - (c) the expenditure on such schemes during the last five years in various States; and
- (d) whether the Ministry has any plans to help States like Jharkhand, where this percentage is low, to mitigate this situation?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI MD. ALI ASHRAF FATMI): (a) The retention rate at primary level in Jharkhand is 50% against the national average of 75% (SES: 2005-06).

(b) Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan (SSA), is a national scheme that promotes universalization of elementary education upto class 8 level, beyond the primary stage of education.

- (c) Expenditure under the Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan (SSA) for the last five years State wise is given in the Statement (See below).
- (d) Educationally backward States receive priority in allocation of funds under the Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan, for instance in 2008-09, 73.28% of total SSA outlay has been targeted to such States including Jharkhand.

Teacher absenteeism in Jharkhand

1418. SHRI PARIMAL NATHWANI: Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government is aware that the rate of teacher absenteeism in Government schools in Jharkhand is 40 per cent, as against the national average of 25 per cent; and
- (b) whether Government has any plans to give some incentives to teachers in such areas to ensure better attendance?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI MD. ALI ASHRAF FATMI): (a) An independent study conducted in the year 2006-07, in 20 major States, involving collection of data on teachers' presence in schools, indicated a teacher presence rate of 81.7% at the primary level and 80.5% at the upper primary level in the country. Jharkhand was not included in this study.
