## Kasturba Balika Vidyalaya Scheme

†1416. SHRI PRABHAT JHA: Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that Government is running a scheme to open Kasturba Balika Vidyalayas in the country, to promote primary education among girls;
  - (b) if so, the details thereof;
- (c) whether it is also a fact that few States are showing indifference towards opening such Vidyalayas;
  - (d) if so, the details of such States;
  - (e) the action being taken by Government in this regard; and
  - (f) the details of amount allocated to various States for this scheme, State-wise?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI MD. ALI ASHRAF FATMI): (a) to (f) The Government of India has sanctioned 2578 Kasturba Gandhi Balika Vidyalaya (KGBVs) which are residential schools for girls at upper primary level in educationally backward blocks of the country. 2159 KGBVs (83.75%) are reported to be operational as on 30.11.2008. A sum of Rs. 122525.48 lakh has been allocated to various States/UTs for implementation of KGBVs during 2008-09 as per Statement (See below). The Government of India is regularly monitoring the implementation of the scheme and intervening with States showing slow performance.

## Primary education in Jharkhand

1417. SHRI PARIMAL NATHWANI: Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether many States of the country have a higher percentage of children having completed primary education than in Jharkhand and whether vocational and higher education equips our young people to gain proper employment and become good productive citizens;
- (b) the details of schemes to encourage children to continue education beyond the primary level;
  - (c) the expenditure on such schemes during the last five years in various States; and
- (d) whether the Ministry has any plans to help States like Jharkhand, where this percentage is low, to mitigate this situation?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI MD. ALI ASHRAF FATMI): (a) The retention rate at primary level in Jharkhand is 50% against the national average of 75% (SES: 2005-06).

(b) Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan (SSA), is a national scheme that promotes universalization of elementary education upto class 8 level, beyond the primary stage of education.
