

(e) Yes, Sir.

(f) This road consists of four core network roads, *i.e.* (i) Badiara to Nandla, (ii) Nandla to Jhalwari, (iii) Jhalwari to Bhamwari and (iv) Bhamwari to Manghara.

The Badiara-Nandla road has been completed under PMGSY Phase-II.

The Nandla-Jhalwari road has been awarded on 23rd August, 2006 and was scheduled to be completed by 22nd August, 2007. The work was held up due to stay granted by the court. The stay has been vacated on 20th September, 2008. After this, the contractor did not start the work for which liquidated damages of 10% amounting to Rs. 14,71,349.00 has been imposed on him on 24th November, 2008.

For Jhalwari-Bhamwari and Bhamwari-Manghara roads, field data to prepare Detailed Project Report (DPR) has been collected but further progress could not be made as the people of Manghara have not yet agreed to donate their private land coming in the alignment. The DPR of this road shall be prepared when the people of the area agree to donate their private land as per government policy.
