- (d) if so, whether Government proposes to derecognize such flying schools which are not providing training as per norms; and
  - (e) if so, the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF CIVIL AVIATION (SHRI PRAFUL PATEL):
(a) and (b) The flying schools in foreign countries are not under the control of Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA), India. They are controlled by the Regulatory Authority of their respective countries and provide flying training as per the rules and regulations established by that country.

- (c) The Government of India does not maintain such records as no permission from Indian DGCA is required for undergoing training in foreign training schools.
- (d) and (e) DGCA has no authority to recognize or de-recognize a flying school established in foreign country. DGCA only accepts the licence issued by an International Civil Aviation Organisation (ICAO) contracting State and converts it to Indian licence in accordance with the Indian rules and regulations.
