(c) To improve the health of financial sector, to reduce the NPAs, to improve asset quality of the banks and to create a good recovery climate, Reserve Bank of India (RBI) and the Government of India have taken various steps which, inter-alia, include prescribing prudential norms for provisioning and classification of non-performing assets, guidelines for prevention of slippages, introduction of Corporate Debt Restructuring mechanism, One Time Settlement schemes, enactment of The Securitisation and Reconstruction of Financial Assets and Enforcement of Security Interest (SARFAESI) Act, 2002, the Credit Information Companies (Regulation) Act, 2005, and the Recovery of Debts due to Banks and Financial Institutions (DRT) Act, 1993 etc. All the banks including the private sector banks take appropriate measures to recover their NPAs in accordance with their loan recovery policies.

Situation at Dalal Street

359. SHRIMATI T. RATNA BAI: Will the Minister of FINANCE be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that there is nightmare on Dalal Street;

(b) if so, the details thereof and the reasons therefor; and

(c) what steps Government is taking to protect the interests of small investors on Dalal Street?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE (SHRI PAWAN KUMAR BANSAL): (a) to (c) Sensex has recorded a fall from 20300.71 on January 1, 2008 to 9975.35 on October 17, 2008. The fall in indices of Indian Securities Market is in line with the fall in the major indices, world over. Volatility is inherent in any market. It is an outcome of perceptions of the investors. - domestic and overseas, retail and institutional - about the economy, the sector and the company. This perception is influenced by many factors including the macro-economic environment, the growth potential of the economy, policy credibility of the government, corporate performance, domestic and international events and market sentiments. The loss suffered by investors on account of the fall in the market price will depend on the composition of their portfolio. The cost of acquisition of securities and corporate benefits received for the portfolio subsequent to the acquisition.

SEBI is also continuously monitoring the situation in consultation with the stock exchanges and the depositories and also taken several measures to protect the interest of investors in securities market.
