- (a) whether it is a fact that the trade of Banarasi sarees is important not only in the country but also in the international market and lakhs of weavers are earning livelihood by means of it in the country;
 - (b) if so, Government's reaction thereto;
- (c) whether it is also a fact that there are total twenty handloom clusters set up at present in the country, out of which Banarasi sarees are manufactured in only one cluster; and
 - (d) if so, the details thereof along with the total number of production units in this one cluster?

- (b) To promote Banarasi sarees, the Government of India is implementing various handloom schemes like the Integrated Handlooms Development Scheme, Handloom Weavers Comprehensive Welfare Scheme, Mill Gate Price Scheme, Marketing and Export Promotion Scheme etc. in the Varanasi cluster.
- (c) and (d) Under the Integrated Handloom Cluster Development Scheme, 20 handloom clusters have been taken for holistic development, out of which, Varanasi is one of the clusters. There are about 12,000 productive handlooms in this cluster covered under the Integrated Handloom Cluster Development Scheme.
