#### Full-fledged Intelligence wing for CRPF

522. MS. MABEL REBELLO:

SHRI B.J. PANDA:

Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that Central Reserve Police Force proposes to have its own full-fledged intelligence wing to achieve better results in counter insurgency operations;

(b) if so, the details thereof;

(c) the extent of this menace in Orissa, Jharkhand, Chhattisgarh, etc.; and

(d) how far will this full-fledged intelligence be effective to control naxal activities in these regions?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI SHRIPRAKASH JAISWAL): (a) to (d) CRPF has been permitted to have its own Intelligence Wing to provide tactical intelligence for enhanced operational effectiveness in the Naxal affected areas. #### Changing face of terrorism in India

523. SHRI PRABHAT JHA:

SHRI PYARELAL KHANDELWAL:

Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that the face of terrorism in India and the *modus-operandi* of the terrorist has changed;

(b) if so, the details thereof with number of terrorist incidents in India from 2004 till date; and

(c) the action Government has taken to control terrorist activities and terrorism in India?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI SHRIPRAKASH JAISWAL): (a) The basic ideology, objectives and nature of targets of the terrorist groups involved in sponsoring or perpetrating terrorist activities in the country continue to remain unchanged, although the means and methodology adopted may change, from time to time, in different areas and incidents, together with progressively growing use of modern technology, communications, etc.

(b) The country has been witnessing violence by terrorist/militant, insurgency and extremist groups in different parts of the country, viz., Jammu & Kashmir, some of the States in the North Eastern region and some States affected by Left Wing Extremism/Naxalite activities. Details in this regard are indicated as statement-I (*see below*). In addition, over the last few years, there have been periodic incidents of terrorist acts, bomb blasts, etc., in some other parts of the country, mainly in the metropolitan/urban areas. A statement indicating details of some of the major incidents of terrorism which have occurred in the hinterland since 2004 are enclosed as statement-II (*see below*).

(c) The Government is pursuing a multi-pronged strategy to deal with the challenges posed by the activities of terrorists/insurgents/extremists in various parts of the country, including measures on the political, security and development fronts. The various steps taken on the security front, *inter-alia*, include vigilance and patrolling on the borders to check infiltration and illegal cross-border activities; deployment of Central forces to aid the State Police Forces in areas prone to terrorist violence; heightened vigil and security arrangements in vulnerable areas and around vital installations; and sharing and exchange of intelligence, and operational coordination, etc. between the Central and State agencies. In addition, assistance is being provided by the Central Government to the State Governments under the scheme of Modernization of State Police Forces (MPF), including assistance for strengthening of the State intelligence machinery, training and equipment support, etc.; liberal grants for raising India Reserve Battalions and Specialized Forces; and reimbursement of various types of Security Related Expenditure (SRE), etc. Various diplomatic initiatives have also been taken by way of bilateral and multi-lateral cooperation to deal with the global imperatives of terrorism, including issues which directly impinge on the security of the country.

#### **Violence against citizens from Minority Communities**

524. SHRI A. VIJAYARAGHAVAN: Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) whether there are incidents of violence against citizens from minority communities in many parts of country during the last three months;

(b) if so, the details including number of people affected, loss of property, cases registered, district-wise State-wise and category-wise, as on date;

(c) the details of steps taken by Central and State Governments to control above atrocities, category-wise, Government-wise and State-wise;

(d) the details of complaint submitted regarding delay by police to lend support to victims of above violence, State-wise and category-wise; and

(e) the steps taken to fix responsibility on the concerned officials, if any?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (DR. SHAKEEL AHMAD): (a) and (b) According to available information, during the current year (till September 2008), 695 incidents of communal violence had taken place in various parts of the country in which 116 persons were killed and 1,680 were injured. State-wise details in this regard are indicated in the Statement. Details of damage to property, etc., in such incidents are not centrally compiled and maintained.
