THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF POWER (SHRIMATI JAYAWANTI MEHTA): (a) As on 30.6.2000, twenty four proposals with a total capacity of 9136.46 MW were under examination by the Central Electricity Authority (CEA) for grant of techno-economic clearance (TEC). In so for as Bihar State is concerned, a proposal for setting up of a super thermal power plant at Barh by the National Thermal Power Corporation (NTPC) (3×660) MW) in Central Sector is under consideration for grant of TEC.
