SHRI BRAHMA KUMAR BHATT : Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state :

(a) the number of people made literate since inception of National Literacy Mission. State-wise, and how many people are still illiterate;

(b) whether activities of Jan Shikshan Sansthans have been enlarged to cover urban and rural areas;

(c) the new Jan Shikshan Sansthans set-up during the last two years, those to be set-up during 2001-2002, location-wise, under whose control they are functioning and the number of beneficiaries; and

(d) when Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan was launched indicating the number of preparatory activities, the districts covered at present and by when all districts would be covered under this and other schemes. for total emancipation of illiterate ?

THE MINISTER OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT : (DR. MURLI MANOHAR JOSHI) : (a) Since the inception of National Literacy Mission, 9.153 crores persons in 15-35 age group have been made literate under different schemes up to 31.12.2000. The State-wise number of persons made literate is enclosed in the Statement-I (See below)

However, as per Census 2001 (provisional), 20.36 crores people in 7 plus age group were made literate during the period 1991-2001. The number of people in the 7 plus age group who are still non-literate is 29.6 crores as per Census 2001 (provisional). Despite the increase of 17.16 crores in the population in the age group of 7 and above, 20.36 crores additional persons have become literate during the decade. Therefore, the absolute number of illiterates has declined for the first time by 3.2 crores.

(c) Out of 50 Jan Shikshan Sansthan approved for Ninth Five Year Plan (1997-2002), 34 Jan Shikshan Sansthan (JSSs) have been sanctioned during the last two years and their locations are indicated in Statement-II (*See below*) 16 new JSSs are proposed to be set-up during 2001-2002 keeping in view the number of slots available and distributive justice among States.

The Jan Shikshan Sansthan are registered Voluntary Organisations and their affairs are managed by the respective Board of Managements approved by Government of India. The number of beneficiaries in various vocational courses conducted by these Sansthan during 1999-2000 and 2000-2001 were 1,20,739 and 1,81,766 respectively.

(d) The Scheme of Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan (SSA) was approved by the Government in November 2000. The preparatory activities include Strengthening of District Office, Capacity Building, Community related Activities, School Based Activities, Survey, MIS Studies etc.

Govt. of India have released grants amounting to Rs. 47.72 crores to 28 States/UTs for starting preparatory activities in 272 non-DPEP districts and for upper primary in 47 DPEP Phase-I districts. It is proposed to cover all the districts of the country under SSA by March, 2002.

The goals of Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan are as follows:

- (i) All 6-14 age children in school/Education Guarantee Scheme Centre/Bridge course by 2003.
- (ii) All 6-14 age children complete five years primary education by 2007 and
- (iii) All 6-14 age children complete eight years of schooling by 2010.
- (iv) Focus on elementary education of satisfactory quality with emphasis on education for life.

- (v) Bridge all gender and social category gaps at primary stage by 2007 and at elementary education level by 2010.
- (vi) Universal retention by 2010.
