SHRI P. PRABHAKAR REDDY : Will the Minister of FOOD PROCESSING INDUSTRIES be pleased to state:

(a) Whether it has come to Government's notice that certain Food Processing Training Centres (FPTCs) which get grants from Government, are non-existent;

(b) if so, the details thereof;

(c) the number of FPTCs given grants during the last three years and those which have given utilization certificates of grants, State-wise;

(d) the outcome of the investigation conducted by Government in this regard recently; and

(e) the fresh steps taken/proposed to be taken by Government to realize the amount of grants from non-existent FPTCs?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF FOOD PROCESSING INDUSTRIES (PROF. CHAMAN LAL GUPTA) : (a) (b) and (d) Seven cases of non-setting up of Food Processing Training Centres, even after receiving the Government assistance, have been reported from National Capital Territory of Delhi, Uttar Pradesh, Tamil Nadu and Orissa.

Reducing Wasteful expenditure FDIs

2020. PROF. M. SANKARALINGAM : Will the Minister of FOOD PROCESSING INDUSTRIES be pleased to state :

(a) whether any efforts have been made by Government to reduce or completely remove wasteful expenditure in Food Processing Industries;

(b) if so, the details of such efforts; and

(c) whether these efforts have borne fruit in reducing wasteful expenditure in these industries?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF FOOD PROCESSING INDUSTRIES (PROF. CHAMAN LAL GUPTA) : (a) to (c) No, report regarding wasteful expenditure in Food Processing Industries has been received. However, it has been estimated that post-harvest wastage of raw materials which are of a perishable nature ranges between 8% to 25 % of their total production. In order to curb such wastage and to increase processing levels, certain policy initiatives have been taken by the Ministry.

1. The Ministry through its Plan Schemes extend financial assistance for setting up and modernization as also for promotion of the entire sector.
2. The Central Excise Duty of processed fruits and vegetable products have been brought down from 16% to 0%
3. In order to encourage setting up of more units in this sector, foreign direct investment in this sector has been brought under automatic route with certain conditions.
