Reducing Wasteful expenditure FDIs

2020. PROF. M. SANKARALINGAM : Will the Minister of FOOD PROCESSING INDUSTRIES be pleased to state:

- (a) whether any efforts have been made by Government lo reduce or completely remove wasteful expenditure in Food Processing Industries:
 - (b) if so. the details of such efforts: and
- (c) whether these efforts have borne fruit in reducing wasteful expenditure in these industries?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF FOOD PROCESSING INDUSTRIES (PROF. CHAMAN LAL GUPTA): (a) to (c) No, report regarding wasteful expenditure in Food Processing Industries has been received. However, it has been estimated that post-harvest wastage of raw matcriels which arc of a perishable nature ranges between 8% to 25 % of their total production. In order to curb such wastage and to increase processing levels, certain policy initiatives have been taken by the Ministry.

- 1. The Ministry through its Plan Schemes extend financial assistance for selling up and modernization as also for promotion of the entire sector.
- 2. The Central Excise Duly of processed finils and vegetable products have been brought down from 16% to 0%
- 3. In order to encourage setting up of more units in this sector, foreign direct investment in this sector has been brought under automatic route with certain conditions.

4. A Draft Policy has been finalized lo provide an enabling environment, lo facilitate setting up of infrastructure, lo bring synergy by backward and forward linkages and to generate demand for processed food through generic advertisement.

A Study conducted at the instance of this Ministry by National Council for Applied Economic Research (NCAER) has revealed that the growth in the Food Processing Industries coming under the domain of the Ministry of Food Processing Industries amounted to 8.5% compared to 6.1% growth in GDP during the period 1996-1997 to 2001-2002. to ihis extent, the efforts initiated by this Ministry have borne fruit.

FPIs in North-Eastern States

- (b) which programmes of training to Food Processing Industries have been started in those Slates; and
- (c) ihc measures laken to encourage Food Processing Industries on individual basis?

THEMINISTEROF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF FOOD PROCESSING INDUSTRIES (PROF. CHAMAN LAL GUPTA); (a) Food Processing Industries are both in t"e organized and unorganized sectors. 73 Fruit and Vegetable Processing Units in North Eastern region including Sikkim have been given licence under FPO upto January. 2001. Data regarding other food processing industries is not maintained centrally by Ministry of Food Processing Industries.

- (b) There is a plan scheme being operated by the Ministry of Food Processing Industries for Personpower Development in Food Processing Industries under which / assistance is provided to Central or Slate Organizations, Educational and Technical Institutions. NGOs and Cooperatives etc. for organising iraining/Personpower Development. The plan schemes of the Ministry are not State specific but are project specific.
- (c) The Ministry of Food Processing Industries provides financial assistance through its Plan Schemes lo private sector Industries. Non-
