THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE (SHRI BALASAHEB VIKHE PATIL): (a) The Medium Term Fiscal Reforms Programme (MTFRP) of eight States, viz. Orissa, Karnataka, Nagaland, Andhra Pradesh. West Bengal, Kerala, Arunachal Pradesh and Himachal Pradesh have been discussed in the Monitoring committee meeting.

- (b) The Governments of Orissa, Karnataka and Nagaland have since, entered into MoU with Ministry of Finance, Government of India.
- (c) So, far. Rs. 731.19 crores have been released to States for the year 2000-01 from the Inventive Fund.

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE(SHRI BALASAHEB VIKHE PATIL): (a) Rural Infrasturcture Development fund (RIDF) was launched in the year 1995-96 with a corpus of Rs. 2000 crore, the fund has since been continued every year with announcements in the successive union budgets and the cumulative corpus of the fund presently stands at Rs. 23,000 crores.

(b) to (d) The total State-wise allocations made by NABARD under the various tranches of RIDF are given in Statement -I (See below). The total State-wise sanctions and disbursals made under RIDF (as on 3-11-2001) are given in Statement-II (See below).
