Indira Gandhi National Centre for Arts

*414. **SHRI MENTAY PADMANABHAM:** Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

(a) what are the activities of the Indira Gandhi National Centre for Arts;

(b) what were the annual allocations for the IGNCA during the last three years; and

(c) what is the monitoring apparatus for IGNCA?

THE MINISTER OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI ARJUN SINGH): (a) The Indira Gandhi National Centre for the Arts encompasses all the arts in their dimension of the past and present dialogue between India and

cognate cultures and other disciplines of science and philosophy and the continual interplay of the rural and the urban, the oral and the textual. The activities of the Centre are carried out through the following four Academic Divisions: (1) Kala Nidhi; (2) Kala Kosa; (3) Janapada Sam-pada; and (4) Kala Darsna. The specific activities of each one of these Divisions are as follows:—

(1) *Kala Nidhi:* Establishment of a Reference Library of multi-media collections for the purpose of research in humanities and the arts; a computerised National Information System and Data Bank on arts, humanities and cultural heritage; and cultural archives on collections of eminent scholars, artists, musicians, dancers, sculptors, etc;

(2) *Kala Kosa:* Programme of research on fundamental terminology re-

lating to the arts in its interface of science, technology, metaphysics, and philosophy, research, editing, translation and publication of fundamental texts related to the Indian arts; reprinting of critical writings on Indian arts; and compilation of a multi-volume encyclopaedia of arts;

(3) *Janapada Sampada*: Collection of material and documentation of folk and tribal arts and crafts; multidisciplinary life-style studies of tribal communities; establishment of two permanent galleries devoted to aboriginal and pre-historic rock art called *Adi-Drasya*, and to sound music and musical instruments called *Adi-Sravya*; multi-disciplinary research on particular regions in the country which have become cultural complexes, and implementation of programmes for children based on the rich heritage of tribal and folk cultures; and

(4) *Kala Darsana*: Organising multi-disciplinary programmes on unified themes.

The four Academic Divisions are given administrative, managerial, and organisational support by a modal division called *Sutradhara*.

(b) Over the last three years, the financial allocations made for the IGMCA are as follows:

(c) The IGNC A has been constituted as an autonomous trust with its Board of Trustees and the Executive Council. The Board of Trustees and the Executive Council carry out the work of the IGNC A according to the provisions of the Deed of Declaration of the IGNC A. Its programme and activities are designed, implemented and monitored by its Board of Trustees.

CBI inquiry into the working of DMS

(a) whether the CBI inquiry into the working of the Delhi Milk Scheme has been completed;

(b) if so, the details of the findings; and

(c) the action taken against the officers of DMS found guilty?

THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE (SHRI BALRAM JAKHAR): (a) to (c) The Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) is not inquiring into the working of the Delhi Milk Scheme. However, complaints, when appropriate, are referred to the CBI for investigation.

Physically disabled persons

(a) whether Government have conducted any survey of the physically-disabled persons in the country;

(b) if so, the details thereof, State and Union Territory-wise; and

THE MINISTER OF WELFARE (SHRI SITARAM KESARI): (a) and (b) The National Sample Survey Organisation conducted sample survey of disabled persons in the country during 1981. Twelve million persons were reported having visual, speech, hearing and locomotor disabilities. State-wise and category-wise information is at Statement-I to IV. (See below).
