made by Power Trading Corporation (PTC) in the financial year 2000-2001 with generators for purchase of power/with consumers for sale of power are given below:

- (i) for supply of 1.44 million units of energy from Maharashtra State Electricity Board (MSEB) of Jindal Vijayanagram Steel Limited (JVSL) through Karnataka Power Transmission Corporation Limited (KPTCL).
- (ii) for supply of 42.32 million units energy to Gujarat Electricity Board (GEB) from Punjab State Electricity Board.
- (iii) for supply of up to 200 MW of power from West Bengal Power Development Corporation Ltd. (WBPDCL) to the deficit states.
- (b) The total energy estimated to be traded by PTC during the current financial year, *i.e.* 2001-2002 is approximately 1500 million units.
- (c) No, Sir. However, PTC has been identified as the Nodal Agency for Indo-Nepal trade of power, and discussions are being held by PTC with States Utilities/SEBs in this regard.
 - (d) Does not arise in view of reply to (c) above.

- (b) The North-Eastern Region runs synchronous with Eastern Region which is surplus in power on a sustained basis. However, due to transmission and distribution constraints and commercial reasons, states of North Eastern Region (except Meghalaya) experienced marginal shortage. Power supply position of North Eastern Region will improve on commissioning of Ranganadi Hydro Electric Project (405 MW) units by March, 2002.
- (c) and (d) Karbi-Longpi Power Project (2x50 MW) an Assam State project is expected to be commissioned during 2003-04. The estimated cost of the project is Rs. 267.27 crores out of which an expenditure of Rs. 154.62 crores has been incurred upto March, 2001.
