REFERENCE TO KILLINGS IN VARANASI

SHRI DIPEN GHOSH (West Bengal): Sir, 15 workers in Varanasi have been killed.... Sir, the Home Minister is here.

MR. CHAIRMAN: Yes, everybody is here; they are not running away!

SHRI DIPEN GHOSH: Fifteen persons have been killed in Varanasi in cold blood—(Interruptions).

MR. CHAIRMAN: I have already permitted Shri Gurudas Das Gupta about it. But let us finish it first. That is the normal procedure. Let papers be laid; let leave be granted to Members who are absenting, and then we will take up other things.

SHRIMATI RENUKA CHOWDHURY (Andhra Pradesh): Let it be on record. I as a Member of this house had been attacked by the Andhra Police—(Interruptions).

SHRI SURESH KALMADI (Maharashtra): Discussion on the assassination of Shri Rajiv Gandhi should be taken up first—(Interruptions).

MR. CHAIRMAN: But first you have to observe the procedure of the House.

SHRI DIPEN GHOSH: The Government could not protect Rajiv Gandhi. But they are protecting a private industrialist of U.P. by killing twenty workers. (Interruptions).
