Development of Forests in T.N.

2779. SHRI S. AGNIRAJ: Will the Minister of ENVIRONMENT AND FORESTS be pleased to state:

(a) what is the total amount of funds allocated for development of forests in Tamil Nadu, during the last three years, district-wise;

(b) whether the funds have been fully utilised; and

(c) whether the State Government has approached for additional grants and if so, the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF ENVIRONMENT AND FORESTS (SHRI T.R. BAALU): (a) and (b) For the development of forests, the Ministry of Environment and Forests implements three major Centrally Sponsored Schemes in the country including Tamil Nadu. These are:

(i) Integrated Afforestation and Eco-Development Project Scheme (IAEPS)

(ii) Area Oriented Fuelwood and Fodder Project Scheme (AOFFPS)

(iii) Non-Timber Forest Produce including medicinal plants Scheme (NTFPS)

While IAEPS is sanctioned on a watershed basis. AOFFP AND NTFP Schemes are sanctioned for the entire State as a whole. The
