THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF PERSONNEL, PUBLIC GRIEVANCES AND PENSIONS (SMT. MARGARET ALVA): (a) 26 I.A.S. officers and 13 I.P.S. officers are on deputation to their home States.

(c) Inter-cadre transfers of officers of All India Services is allowed when two officers borne on different State Cadres get married. While allowing such transfers, care is taken to ensure that the officer seeking transfer does not, in the process, get transferred to his or her home state.

This report was placed on the Table of the House in May, 1975, copies of which would be available in the Parliament library.

(b) and (c) The Government has since taken decisions on these recommendations and announced Drug Policy in March, 1978 followed by "Measures for Rationalisation Quality Control and Growth of Drugs & Pharmaceutical Industry in India" in December, 1986 and activities of the Pharmaceutical Industry are guided in accordance with the provisions contained therein.
