

Radiation Leakage from Kota Nuclear Power Plant

344. SHRI KRISHNA KUMAR BIRLA: Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that there has been radiation leakage from the Kota Nuclear Plant having serious effects on the inhabitants of the adjoining villages;

(b) if so, whether Government have made any detailed analysis of the radiation and its effects;

(c) if so, what are the details thereof; and

(d) what measures have been taken by Government to check the radiation leakage to prevent serious health hazards on the inhabitants of the neighbouring villages?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF PERSONNEL, PUBLIC GRIEVANCES AND PENSIONS (SMT. MARGARET ALVA):
(a) No, Sir.

(b) and (c) Releases to the environment from Kota or any other nuclear power plant in the country are regulated by the limits prescribed by Atomic Energy Regulatory Board (AERB) and complied with by the operating stations. Such limits are in line with the guidelines stipulated by international bodies like International Commission on Radiological Protection (ICRP). Radiation dose due to releases from Kota plant forms only a small percentage of the radiation dose due to the unavoidable natural background radiation.

(d) Environmental Survey Laboratories (ESL) are set up at all operating nuclear power stations including the Kota plant to monitor samples of water, soil, food, air and various other products for radioactivity contents on a periodic basis. ESLs start functioning prior to start of nuclear power station operation to establish base

line data for future comparison. The finding of ESLs are reviewed by AERB. The existing regulatory framework provides for continuous review in safety and environmental aspects relating to nuclear power plants.

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF CHEMICALS AND FERTILIZERS (SHRI CHINTA MOHAN): (a) and (b) The BICP has not examined the fair selling price of paraxylene produced by all indigenous manufacturers.

(c) There is no price control in the petrochemicals sector, and as such the question of fixing prices does not arise.
