THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF RAILWAYS (SHRI MALLIKARJUN): (a) There is only one twin-Saloon for the use of the President of India. In addition, there are 333 bogie (8-wheelers) 14 (6-wheelers) and 422 (4-wheelers) Inspection Carriages on all the Zonal Railways and Production Units.

(b) Depending upon the need/exigency of work, all officers of the Railways are authorised to use Inspection Carriages.

(c) No, Sir. To discontinue use of the inspection carriages is not considered to be in the interest of Railway working.

New labour policy

The report of the Committee is proposed to be discussed in the next session of the Indian Labour Conference.
