734. SHRI VITHALBHAI M. PATEL:  
Will the Minister of PLANNING AND  
PROGRAMME IMPLEMENTATION be

(a) whet'ner it is a fact that a number  
of public sector projects are delayed;

(b) if so, the number of such projects;

(c) what would be the amount of escalated  
cost for these projects; and

(d) what steps Government propose to  
take for clearing these projects speedily?

BHARDWAJ): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) and (c) As per monitoring system of  
Deptt. of Programme Implementation, as on  
1st April 1991, 181 central projects, each  
costing over Rs. 20 crore, were delayed with  
respect to the latest approved schedule and  
their total latest anticipated cost was of the  
order of Rs. 53, 400 crore.

(d) The Deptt. of Programme Imple-  
mentation has been monitoring the im-  
plementation of these proiects, and has been  
hie'nlightin« the problem areas for  
appropriate and timely action by th<sub>p</sub> con-  
cerned authorities, in order to expedite the  
timely completion of the projects.
