(d) The Government has taken various steps to boost the export of tea which include programmes on improving quality of Indian tea, creating consumer awareness of specialty Indian tea in select markets, participation in major trade exhibitions abroad, media campaigns, exchange of tea delegations, buyers seller meets, field sampling etc.

Development of Organic Tea

169. SHRI RAMACHANDRA KHUNTIA: Will the Minister of COMMERCE AND INDUSTRY be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government have any proposal to develop organic tea without the use of chemical pesticides;

(b) if so, the details thereof alongwith the likely technical and financial assistance to be provided by Food and Agricultural Organisation (FAO) for the project; and

(c) the steps taken/proposed to be taken by Government to provide the new technology to tea growers in the country for development of organic tea and for generic promotion of tea, based on its health benefits?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF COMMERCE AND INDUSTRY (SHRI RAJIV PRATAP RUDY): (a) to (c) Yes, Sir. Government has already taken several steps for development of the organic tea sector. The Tea Board has been declared the accrediting body for organic tea at the National level. In addition a project proposal for development, production and promotion of organic tea has been submitted by Tea Board for financial assistance from Common Fund for Commodities (CFC) an international body associated with the Food and Agricultural Organisation (FAO). The project is basically aimed at development of techniques and technology for the production of organic tea in India by setting up of model organic farms. The project would also develop acceptable international export standards for organic tea and put in place a

certification mechanism. The duration of the project is three years. During the project period an attempt will be made to identify and assess the demand for organic tea in the export markets and develop marketing strategy including a relevant promotion package for this market. The total estimated cost of the project is US\$1.425m of which the CFC is expected to provide US\$0.329m by way of loan and US\$0.971m as grant in aid. The balance would be contributed by the Tea Board and tea industry. Besides, a National programme for organic production and preparation of necessary guidelines thereon has also been finalised.

New industries in NER

170. DR. ARUN KUMAR SARMA: Will the Minister of COMMERCE AND INDUSTRY be pleased to refer to answer to Unstarred Question 807 given in the Rajya Sabha on 31st July, 2000 and state:

(a) the action taken for inclusion of existing industries and industries to be established outside the specified areas, under the purview of New Industrial Policy for the North-East;

(b) the revised notification made in this regard; and

(c) the details of investment made in the NER after the notification indicating the reasons of low response?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF COMMERCE AND INDUSTRY (DR. RAMAN SINGH): (a) and (b) Request for amendment of the New Industrial Policy and other concessions in the North-Eastern Region, dated 24.12.1997 is under examination.

(c) Capital investment amounting to Rs. 249.09 crores has been made in the North-Eastern Region as on 31.3.2001. The reasons for low investment are lack of industrial infrastructure, poor road connectivity and geographical bottlenecks in the region.
