duty of Foreign Travel Scheme and adopt other mechanism to curtail the use of Foreign Travel Scheme?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY \mathbf{OF} FINANCE (SHRI RAMESHWAR THAKUR): (a) Unauthorised sale of Foreign change attracts punishment under the law. Abolition of Foreign Exchange Conservation (Travel) Tax on travel under Foreign Travel Scheme to obviate illegal sale of foreign exchange by NRIs and tourists is not feasible. mainly due to the reasons that this will be discriminatory to persons undertaking travel for various other purposes coming under the purview of Foreign Exchange Conservation (Travel) Tax.

(b) No such proposal is under consideration.

Foreign loan lying unutilised

1248. SHRI KRISHAN SHARMA: Will the Minister of FINANCE be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that loan worths 12 billion is lying unutilised in the country at present;
- (b) if so, the details thereof and the reasons therefor;
- (c) what are the details of the projects for which these loans were negotiated; and
- (d) what action is being taken by Government in the matter?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE (SHRI RAMESHWAR THAKUR): (a) and (b) At the end of June'91, the total undisbursed balance under the World Bank line of assistance was 12.158 billion US dollars.

The undisbursed balance appears large in aggregate terms but is dependent on the time profile of various projects. Apart from gestation period of externally aided projects, delayed utilisation arises from factors which inter alia include exchange rate fluctuations, inadequate counterpart funding by State Government, land acquisition procedures tardy project specific issues. and other Such problems sometimes lead to a delay in utilisation of World Bank assistance which is taken care extension/restructuring through projects.

- (c) A list of on-going projects with Bank assistance is enclosed.
- (d) Implementation delays are addressed through strengthening the counterpart resource support, close monitoring by Ministries with special emphasis on timely procurement action by project authorities and simplification of procedures in respect of released of foreign exchange, tender evaluation etc. In addition projects are being extensively monitored at different levels including the State Governments.
