Replacing cash compensatory support by R.E.P. Licence

THE MINISTER OF STATE (IN-DEPENDENT CHARGE) OF THE MINISTRY OF COMMERCE (SHRI P. CHIDAMBARAM): (a) and (b) The Government has suspended the Scheme of Cash Compensatory Support with effect from 3-7-91 in view of the re-structuring and expansion of the Replenishment Licence Scheme and also the present level of exchange rates.

Under the revised REP Policy, all exports have a uniform REP rate of 30 per cent of the FOB value, in place of rates ranging from 5 to 20 per cent of the FOB value. Special rates for gems and jewellery, certain metal based handicrafts and newspapers/journals/periodicals will, however, continue. Replenishment Licensing Scheme (REP) has now become the principal instrument for export related imports and can be freely traded.
