

Want of sufficient irrigation facilities for paddy crops in Cauvery Belt Region of Karaikal

774. SHRI V NARAYANASAMY: Will the Minister of WATER RESOURCES be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government are aware of the fact that due to failure of monsoon for the last four years, the Cauvery belt region of Karaikal, a part of Pondicherry region, is suffering for want of sufficient irrigation facilities for paddy crops,

(b) whether the Cauvery Water Tribunal set up by Government has passed any interim award for the benefit of riparian States like Tamil Nadu and Pondicherry; and

(c) when the final award relating to Cauvery water dispute will be expected?

THE MINISTER OF WATER RESOURCES WITH ADDITIONAL CHARGE OF THE MINISTRY OF SURFACE TRANSPORT (SHRI MANUBHAI KOTADIA): Apart from reliability of monsoon rains, the success of irrigation depends on condition of the distribution network, water distribution efficiency, location of irrigation areas in the command and availability of back up storages.

(b) No, Sir.

(c) Inter-State Water Disputes Act, 1956, does not prescribe any time limit for the Tribunal to give its award

Delivery of Letters in Pondicherry..

(a) whether Government are aware of the fact that the letters to be delivered in Pondicherry reach the addressee after a long period even though it may be local delivery; and

(b) whether Government propose to set up RMS postal distribution system in the Pondicherry region?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF PETROLEUM AND CHEMICALS AND THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF COMMUNICATIONS (SHRI JAI PRAKASH): (a) Yes, Sir. There have been some complaints about delay in delivery of mails

(b) At present there is no proposal or justification for opening a R.M.S. Sorting Office at Pondicherry, as suitable alternate arrangements exist.

Setting up autonomous Corporations for Telephone and allied Telecom Services

(c) the extent to which the telecom services are likely to improve as a result of the above decision?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF PETROLEUM AND CHEMICALS AND THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF COMMUNICATIONS (SHRI JAI PRAKASH): (a) to (c) No, Sir, no decision to this effect has been taken so far. The Government has set up a High Level Committee to go into all aspects of restructuring of Telecom Organisation in the country and recommending the most appropriate organisational structure keeping in view the developmental and operational needs as well as the financial implications etc. Appropriate decisions in the matter will be taken after receipt of the Committee's report
