

(b) whether Government have identified those herbs and plants; and if so, the details thereof;

(c) what steps Government are taking or have taken so far to check extinction of such vital plants?

THE MINISTER OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (PROF. SHAKEELUR REHMAN): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) Several medicinal plants like *Rauwolfia serpentina*, *Saussurea-obvallata*, *Saussurea costus*, *Podophyllum henandrum*, *Coptis teeta*, *Picrorhiza kurroa*, *Aoonitum heterophyllum*, *Dactylorhiza hetagirea* are getting depleted due to over exploitation and forest clearings.

(c) Following steps have been taken for protection of endangered species of plants including plants of medicinal value:

(i) Highly endangered species of plants including medicinal plants are placed periodically in Appendix I of Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species (CITES) which prohibits international trade in such plants. Export policy also prohibits export of certain rare medicinal plants and derivatives.

(ii) 71 National Parks have been set up which help in protection of threatened species of plants.

(iii) The Botanical Survey of India is cultivating several endangered plants species in their experimental gardens.

(iv) A scheme for Captive breeding of Endangered Species of plants has been introduced in the Botanical Survey of India recently.

(v) The Ministry of Health and Family Welfare are formulating a scheme to be operated during 8th Plan for providing financial assistance to various Government, Semi-Government, organisations for development and cultivation of identified medicinal plants.
