THE MINISTER OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (PROF. SHAKE-ELUR REHMAN): (a) and (b) Yes Sir, there are 41 vacancies of Nursing Orderly, Cook, Bearer and other Group 'D' posts in the various centres of All India Institute of Medical Sciences at present. Recruitment action for filling these vacancies has already been initiated. Details are given in the Statement.

Will the Minister of PETROLEUM AND CHEMICALS be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government's attention has been drawn to the news-item 'IBRD team coming for talks on funding' which appeared in the daily 'Business and Political Observer' of 5th December 1990;

(b) what is the time schedule for completion of the ONGC's Rs. 4000/- crores project to stop gas flaring in the Bombay High oilfield; and

(c) what steps Government plan to take to expedite implementation of the project, especially the approval from the World Bank for the foreign exchange component to ensure economic viability of the project?

THE MINISTER OF PETROLEUM AND CHEMICALS AND PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS (SHRI SATYA PRAKASH MALAVIYA): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) and (c) ONGC's project to stop gas flaring is expected to be completed in about three years from date of Government approval. Expeditious negotiations with the World Bank have been taken up.
