## SHRI CHATURANAN MISHRA:

Will the Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government propose to introduce countrywide "Dial a Doctor" service through which medical services can be summoned within minutes of dialling a three digit number;

(b) if so, what are the details and the modalities of the proposed scheme; and

(c) by when the said scHeme would be introduced throughout the country and whether the State Governments have agreed to introduce such schetme?

THE MINISTER OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (PROF. SHA-JCEELUR REHMAN): (a) A scheme is being formulated by DGHS. The involvement of State Governments will be necessary since hospital fall in the state list under the Constitution.

(b) The details and modalities of the proposed scheme are being worked out.

(c) As the scheme is in a very preliminary stage, it is not possible to give a firm date by which it will be introduced throughout the country. In the first stage, the scheme is proposed to be introduced only in big cities where there is better net working and availability of good communication system. State Governments win be involved 'n the matter after the details and modalities are worked out.

#### Oil production at Bombay High

423. SHRI HARVENDRASINGH HANSPAL: Will the Ministerof PET ROLEUM AND CHEMICALSbe pleas ed to state:

(a) whether the Oil and Natural Gas Commission has worked out a detailed scheme to boost oil production at Bombay High;

(b) if so, what are the details of the scheme worked out by Oil and Natural Gas Commission;

(c) what are the details of the national and international companies which will be engaged by ONGC in oil production at Bombay High; and

(d) what is the target of oil produc tion fixed?

THE MINISTER FOR PETROLEUM AND CHEMICALS AND PARLIA-MENTARY AFFAIRS (SHRI SATYA PRAKASH MALAVJYA): (a) and (b) The Bombay High Field of ONGC is at its plateau rate of production since 1983-84. Efforts are being made to arrest the natural decline and extend the plateau period. For doing so, besides various maintenance, repairs and stimulations jobs of the wells, ONGC has carried out infill drilling and introduced artificial lift systems. L-II and L-ITI reservoirs are also being further developed.
