Gap between availability and short age of Power

(b) if so, what is the present position and what would be the requirement for d'fferent sectors by the end of the century; and

(c) what steps Government propose to take to bridge the gap?

THE MINISTER /F STATE IN THE MINISTRY of ENERGY (SHRI BABANRAO DHAKANE): (a) and (b) During the period April-Novem ber, 1990, the enery requirement in the country was 172503 million units against which the availability was

159724 million units. During November, 1990, the energy requirement. the country was 21926 MUs agains+ which the availability was 20120 Mus-The energy requirement at the end of the century would be 593, 776 million units.

(c) The various measures being taken to improve the availability oi power include expiating commuss ioning of new generating units, implementation of short gestation projects, improving the performance af existing power statijrs, reducing T& D losses, implements tion of demano management and energy conservation measures and arranging transfer of supply from surplus to deficit areas.
